

The Life And Times of Barry Humphries:

Barry Humphries was an Australian actor best known for his character Dame Edna Everage, a sharp-tongued housewife and talk show host.

Humphries initially attended Melbourne University but left early to pursue an acting career. His London stage debut was in *The Demon Barber* (1959), and he later appeared in various productions of the musical *Oliver* as well as in several one-man stage shows.

In 1955 he created the character Edna Everage for a skit he was performing. His character arose out of his desire to lampoon the people and standards of his parent's generation.

Edna was at times condescending, insulting and intrusive but still likeable and sincere. Edna's greeting to her fans was always "Hello Possums" and her consistently loveable nature endeared her to a high fan base around the world.

In addition to Edna, Humphries created several other comic characters that attracted attention, such as Sir Les Patterson, a vulgar, drunken Australian politician.

Humphries debuted Edna to a wider audience on the first evening of television broadcasting in Australia in 1956. The Edna character was made a Dame on television in the 1970s in a spontaneus gesture by Australian Prime Minister Gough Whitlam.



His novel about an Australian television star *My Life as Me* (2004) in many ways mirrored his own life. He also produced a number of books ostensibly by Dame Edna Everage.

Following a fall in the same year, Barry.Humphries died after complications from his hip surgery in 2023.

Harvard Commencement Speech, JK Rowling 2008

In 2008, The Harry Potter author delivered a powerful graduation speech at Harvard University.

It was so compelling it went on to become the most-viewed commencement speech on Harvard's website and was later printed and distributed as a booklet.

Rowling shared with the recent graduates her experience from working at Amnesty. She told them about the nightmares that would haunt her after reading letters and testimonials of people living in fear under totalitarian regimes.


The novelist urged the crowd to use their imagination for compassion by putting themselves in the shoes of the less fortunate and to use their influence to bring forth positive change for those who need it the most.

The Fastest Trains in The World:

Train technology has transformed travel



Shanghai Maglev - The journey from Shanghai to Shanghai Airport takes only 7 minutes and 20 seconds thanks to the incredible maglev trains. This train uses magnets to alevate above the tracks which reduce friction allowing the train to reach speeds of 430 km/h. Following a serious accident in Germany in 2012, the Chinese authorities have reduced the speed at which the train runs to 298 km.



Harmony CRH 380E - The Harmony is an electric high speed train which travels between Shanghai and Beijing. It took four and a half years to build the tracks which cost in excess of \$17 billion. It is the world's second fastest train cutting down the travel time from 10 hours to less than 3 hours travelling at speeds of 380 km/h. The design uses a greatly improved vibration system and improved air tightness for passenger comfort. Advanced sound absorbing materials and insulation are used for the carriages.

The Nestle Food Company:

Henri Nestle, born in 1814 was a chemist and inventor who later became a world renowned confectioner. In many ways he was a man ahead of his time. Working in his own chemistry laboratory in Vevey, Switzerland he developed and produced a large range of products. The year was 1867 and at a time of high infant mortality which provided Henti with the incentive and drive to turn his attention to food products.

With the help of his wife, he developed food for babies that were unable to be breastfed.

He proclaimed it was based on "wholesome Swiss milk and a cereal component baked by a special process" which he had invented. Before his product could be tested, a friend came to him with her sickly baby who had been born a month premature. Unable to tolerate his mother's milk and weak after persistent vomiting, the child was dying.


This led Nestle to feed the baby with a diluted version of his formula which to everyone's relief had almost instant results. The news that Neste's formula had saved the baby's life quickly spread among local mothers, midwives and doctors.



The life-saving product led to widespread success and its use quickly extended to the elderly and those unwell. Safety and quality control have always been priorities for the Nestle brand creating food and beverages that all consumers can trust without reservation.

The Nestle company relies heavily on nutrition science and scientific knowledge and has established the world's largest private nutrition and food research organization, employing over 5,000 people across 34 worldwide research and development facilities.

A real Kiwi icon



Henri Nestle' 1814-1890

In 1874, Nestle developed its first condensed milk product which eventually made its way to New Zealand in the luggage of European immigrants. In 1885 production commenced in New Zealand at Invercargill in the South Island and in 1901 the product was renamed *Highlander Milk* to reflect the area in which it was being produced.





In 1920 a newly built factory in Auckland started producing milk chocolate and by 1929 the factory in Parnell was producing close to 42 tons of chocolate each month. Nescafe' was initially imported from the USA and repacked for New Zealand consumption but in 1962 a factory was opened in Wiri, Auckland. Nescafe was included in ration kits issued to American soldiers during WW2 and Sir Edmund Hillary packed the product for his Mt Everest climb in 1953. It is reported the astronauts also enjoyed Nescafe whilst on the moon.



Milo was originally created in Australia in 1934 to help children who were undernourished gain more vitamins and minerals during the Great Depression. It is still made from the same key ingredients as in 1935.

kidnapped, maybe in an attempt to extort money or perhaps even coerce George in to joining the local mafia.



This ancient Roman doll is made of coloured ivory and was found in the stone coffin of an 8-year old boy who lived more than 1,800 years ago.




The Magic Tap, Cadiz, Spain -




Although Michelangelo's statue of David is often regarded as the Western ideal of male beauty, it turns out that David is actually cross-eyed.

The Tallest Statue in The World:

The definition of a statue is a free-standing sculpture representing one or more people or animals in their entirety or partially such as a bust. The height of the statue includes the structure that the monument is standing on.

Standing at 182 metres - or nearly 600 feet tall - the biggest statue in the world is the *Statue of Unity* in Gujarat, India. The statue was unveiled on October 31, 2018 and replaced the Spring Temple Buddha in Pingdingshan, China which stands at approximately 420 feet in height.

The Statue of Unity is twice the height of Big Ben and three times the height of the Statue of Liberty. It is a colossal statue of Indian statesman and independent activist Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel (1875-1950). He was the first Home Minister of India and adhered to Mahatma Gandhi's independence movement.

The Statue of Unity is located on a river island facing the Sardar Sarovar Dam on the river Narmada, 100 kilometres southeast of the city of Vadodara, Gujarat, India.



Police solve case of the missing bacon


A Grand Rapids resident told police last week that someone had entered his home during the night and taken five pounds of bacon from the refrigerator.



Every last bit of food that I like must be banished Till all the additional ounces have vanished.


I won't have a cookle--not even a lick.
